Meaning an old 60-Watt gives off about 800-Lumens and LED bulb that gives off about 800-lumens only uses 9-Watts of energy. CF is Compact Fluorescent.

This means I will be catching KY when I come back from the eastern states. It will add a few hundred miles to the trip.

Today it looks Like I catch all 5 Great Lakes and all the Woodstock's without going too far out of my way. With Google I found 12 Woodstock's. The list is below. If I missed any let me know and I will add it to my list.

As I said before this is the current plan. It could all change before I get finished typing. ©



EWT Flooring

Well Michelle hired a company to install the flooring. I am glad because it was a little more than we could handle. They have everything they need to get the job done. We would have to get new tools and struggle to learn how to do it just to not do it again for years and years.

Before the first of June it should be a done job.

Road Trip

I pretty much have my route mapped out for my Road Trip. The path is a general route and most likely the way I will head. I may change my mind at each intersection.

I am thinking I might head East first. I haven't been to the eastern states very often. I will head in the direction of Main then head back to Michigan via Canada. Then across the upper US to North Dakota. Then down through Kamas then north and back around to California. After that I can cover the southern states and head back to Illinois via Tennessee.

This is a rough idea. I don't have my map with me, so I am trying to remember it backwards. I was going to drive in the other direction, so I have my head screwed on the other way and I can't visualize the map right now.

If I head east first I can abort when I get to Wisconsin if needed. 13,000 miles is a long drive!

My plans are to stop in Sedona, Santa Fe, Iron Mountain, St Cloud, St. Johns, Hutchison and Maquoketa to visit and/or sight see.

Since I am still here, you must know I don't have a schedule just yet.

I need to check out my Camper and my other gear to make sure it is all working.

Do I need a new Camera and Laptop? I think I may need a camera or at least new batteries. The laptop I want now!

Other than that, I need to gather some funds. I need enough to pay for \$3000 for fuel. I need to get to Indiana or I will have to drive through Chicago to get back home. ©

I am sure I may be over thinking this whole Road Trip.

Plumbing

I have a plumber coming over Tuesday to check out the plumbing in the bathroom. The pressure is very, very low. I think the steel pipes have plugged up and it all needs to be replaced. The rest of the house is copper and working just fine.

The plumbing was installed in the 1950's when all they used was the galvanized steel pipes. I have seen the insides after 50 years of use. It isn't pretty.

Flooring

Well today is the day they will be installing the new flooring at EWT. I will see how the big guys do it. I have been doing things for myself for so long I have got set in my ways. I may never install flooring again, but I can learn how it is done. Ooo, coffee is hot!

Road Trip

Instead of watching TV all night, I worked on my trip plans. I started refining my route. I broke it down into smaller paths. Each day trip is near 300 to 400 miles and/or 5 to 6 hours driving.

I used Google Maps to plot the trip, so I could see how it looks. There a few places I need to put another stop into the route to stay in the state or drive miles out of the way.

I decided to route it to the east this time. It should make me get back from Canada. I should get to Iron Mountain Michigan about day 12 or 13. And in Sedona Arizona around day 27 or 28.

Remember this is only a rough plan. I have only got to Sedona and I was tired. 28 days on the road tired. © Besides it was bed time.

I need to go over the first 28 days and make sure each day is not too long or too many miles. I went through the route very fast and did not look too close to the hours or miles. There were a few times when I had very low miles but long on hours. Either long hours or lots of miles will do me in! I need to go over my route when I get to the end.

I started working on it a little but most of the tools I needed were in my toolbox out at EWT. I didn't feel like driving out and getting them. After all I will be there again today. Never do today what you can put off until tomorrow! ©

Road Trip

My general route is plotted. That part is ready. Now I can start working on the Camper. I asked Marie, my sister, if she wanted to ride along. I am not sure she wants to go the two months. She did sound like she was interested.

Many people think, I should not go alone. When I walked across Spain I went alone, but I was never alone. This trail is about the same amount of time, but I will be alone in the Camper most of the time 48 states in 48 days doesn't sound so bad. It is about 14,000 miles in the metal box! Plumbing

Shower plumbing is fixed. I could use it as a car wash now. I have a couple things to change and it will be all done for another twenty years.

The shower head that came with the unit dumps too much water. And I need to use a shorter pipe on the spout. The new one is different.

Once that is done I can start working on the sink water. It has the same problem as the shower did.

I had Community Plumbing come over and look at my water flow problem. He told me the problem wasn't as bad as I thought. He thought it was most likely the mixing valve in the center of the faucet. He was right! The shower faucet was plugged. I could see it. Being it was so old I could not find a new part. I could have had fixed it, but I could not get it apart. I decided to just replace the whole faucet. Thanks Community Plumbing!

EWT Flooring

The floor is in and it looks great. Stop in and look at it when you get some time.

Today I will start putting in the baseboard. There is 2-300 feet of it to install. Michelle is already doing her thing to make everything look good!

Bad Days

Well, the days are not so bad as they are getting frustrated. A bunch of frustratingness!

I installed a new faucet in the shower and it went ok. Not great but ok. I need to make some adjustments because the new one was a little different size. I could not find the same faucet after 20 years. I kind of expected that. I had to change piping because it needed to be shorter. All in all, it went as well as I thought it might.

Job done! Well you would think so. I still have the sink faucet to change.

The sink is mostly open so There wasn't much to do to get at the plumbing to replace.

I looked it all over and saw the packing on one of the shutoff valves had lime on it. That means it had been leaking. Ok, I'll change it to.

It was a little harder unhooking all the old plumbing because I had the stand on my head to get to it under the sink. All in all, thing seemed to go just fine. Well that is until I tried to remove the nuts that hold the faucet itself. I could not get under the cabinet enough to get a good reach on the nut to loosen it. I tried and tried, and it wasn't working.

Ok they make a Special Tool for that and I don't have one. I looked up on Menards web side and there a few different kinds ranging from six to thirty-nine-ninety-five. I thought Cork might have one I could use. He did, and I went over and got it.

Later I decided to get it apart. Ok I didn't tell you I tried removing the cabinet to make it easier to get at those nuts on the faucet. It was open when I installed in in 1989! Anyway, after removing all the screws that held the cabinet it would not move! It would not move! Not even a little.

I didn't want to break it. I thought about just taking a hammer and busting it up and replacing it. First, I looked up the replacement cost. A cheap vanity cost almost \$600.00 and I would still need a top for it. Probably \$1000 before I was done. Let's not break anything!

So Special Tool in hand I went in and removed the hoses and the first nut that hold the faucet. Then I removed the other hose and remove the other nut.

After working with the special tool at many different angles one of the ears broke off the nut. These nuts are plastic and plastic gets brittle over the years. It is almost 30 years since I installed it.

Anyway, I tried and tried and I'm frustrated right now!

I quit for the day after looking up another kind of Special Tool for those plastic nuts. I was on the way out to Menards when I ended up here.

I went by EWT to pick up the salt spreader. It need to be cleaned out. Then I forgot those plastic nuts to make sure I get the right special tool. I must go back home and grab the pictures for the Special Tool I think I want. So, I have made 3-4 trips back home because I am frustrated. I am here now!

I just don't bend like I used to for crawling under that sink. Maybe this new Special Tool will help.

I guess that is enough venting my frustratingness. I will go home and then to Menards. ©

Here it the 23rd and I am no closer to heading out on my Road Trip. I looked those 22 Woodstocks and two of them are off the list. One looks to just be a School and the other one looks to be a crossing of Woodstock street and Woodstock road. I will look at them again later.

I plotted most of the rest of them into my plan. There are twenty Woodstock's to see. I might have added another thousand miles to the trip.

This 48-State Road Trip is getting longer and longer. Someone here at Starbucks said that I should stop at all the Starbucks I can find too. Today there are 13,930 in the US. That is about one every mile of my Road Trip. I think I will pass on that!



Maybe I'll stop at one per state. That would be about one a day. I could handle that! If I keep adding scheduled stops to this Road Trip I will be driving and stopping, driving and stopping, driving and stopping, etc. I will be on the road for the next 20 years. I started out with 48-states in 48-days. I am up to 51 states in 55 days.

I need to get out of here for a while. The walls are closing in on me.

29-May-18 5:56am @home 87° clear

We are finally over this holiday weekend. It was in the 90s making it hot! Then there were the brakes on the Camper were acting up. Well, the dishwasher smoked itself. And all the other stuff from before had to be put back together. Don't you just feel sorry for me©

Well don't! The bathroom is back together for now. I still need to replace those old pipes, but it can wait for now. It will have to because I have spent most of my funding. I have the brakes on the camper fixed. They say it was just rust in the drums. The controller on the dishwasher cost about half the price of a new machine. Yep, it should be here tomorrow. I bought this a very long time ago. The service manual was printed in 1989. I don't remember how long ago I bought but \$360 is more than I want to pay for a part when I can buy a whole new dishwasher for a \$597.34.

I thought the brakes were going to be a major job, so it was only about \$80. But I need shocks and they will cost over \$600. They can wait for now.
