IN CONGRESS, JULY 4, 1776 The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America



hen in the Course of human events it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another

and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. — That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, - That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly all experience hath shewn that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object evinces a design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their future security. — Such has been the patient sufferance of these

Colonies; and such is now the necessity which constrains them to alter their former Systems of Government. The history of the present King of Great Britain is a history of repeated injuries and usurpations, all having in direct object the

establishment of an absolute Tyranny over these States. To prove this, let Facts be submitted to a candid world.

He has refused his Assent to Laws, the most wholesome and necessary for the public good.

He has forbidden his Governors to pass Laws of immediate and pressing importance, unless suspended in their operation till his Assent should be obtained; and when so suspended, he has utterly neglected to attend to them.

He has refused to pass other Laws for the accommodation of large districts of people, unless those people would relinquish the right of Representation in the Legislature, a right inestimable to them and formidable to tyrants only.

He has called together legislative bodies at places unusual, uncomfortable, and distant from the depository of their Public Records, for the sole purpose of fatiguing them into compliance with his measures.

He has dissolved Representative Houses repeatedly, for opposing with manly firmness his invasions on the rights of the people.

He has refused for a long time, after such dissolutions, to cause others to be elected, whereby the Legislative Powers, incapable of Annihilation, have returned to the People at large for their exercise; the State remaining in the mean time exposed to all the dangers of invasion from without, and convulsions within.

He has endeavoured to prevent the population of these States; for that purpose obstructing the Laws for Naturalization of Foreigners; refusing to pass others to encourage their migrations hither, and raising the conditions of new Appropriations of Lands.

He has obstructed the Administration of Justice by refusing his Assent to Laws for establishing Judiciary Powers.

He has made Judges dependent on his Will alone for the tenure of their offices, and the amount and payment of their salaries.

He has erected a multitude of New Offices, and sent hither swarms of Officers to harass our people and eat out their substance. He has kept among us, in times of peace, Standing Armies without the Consent of our legislatures.

He has affected to render the Military independent of and superior to the Civil Power.

He has combined with others to subject us to a jurisdiction foreign to our constitution, and unacknowledged by our laws; giving his Assent to their Acts of pretended Legislation:

For quartering large bodies of armed troops among us:

For protecting them, by a mock Trial from punishment for any Murders which they should commit on the Inhabitants of these States:

For cutting off our Trade with all parts of the world:

For imposing Taxes on us without our Consent:

For depriving us in many cases, of the benefit of Trial by Jury:

For transporting us beyond Seas to be tried for pretended offences:

For abolishing the free System of English Laws in a neighbouring Province, establishing therein an Arbitrary government, and enlarging its Boundaries so as to render it at once an example and fit instrument for introducing the same absolute rule into these Colonies

For taking away our Charters, abolishing our most valuable Laws and altering fundamentally the Forms of our Governments:

For suspending our own Legislatures, and declaring themselves invested with power to legislate for us in all cases whatsoever.

He has abdicated Government here, by declaring us out of his Protection and waging War against us. He has plundered our seas, ravaged our coasts, burnt our towns, and destroyed the lives of our people.

He is at this time transporting large Armies of foreign Mercenaries to compleat the works of death, desolation, and tyranny, already begun with circumstances of Cruelty & Perfidy scarcely paralleled in the most barbarous ages, and totally unworthy the Head of a civilized nation.

He has constrained our fellow Citizens taken Captive on the high Seas to bear Arms against their Country, to become the executioners of their friends and Brethren, or to fall themselves by their Hands.

He has excited domestic insurrections amongst us, and has endeavoured to bring on the inhabitants of our frontiers, the merciless Indian Savages whose known rule of warfare, is an undistinguished destruction of all ages, sexes and conditions.

In every stage of these Oppressions We have Petitioned for Redress in the most humble terms: Our repeated Petitions have been answered only by repeated injury. A Prince, whose character is thus marked by every act which may define a Tyrant, is unfit to be the ruler of a free people.

Nor have We been wanting in attentions to our British brethren. We have warned them from time to time of attempts by their legislature to extend an unwarrantable jurisdiction over us. We have reminded them of the circumstances of our emigration and settlement here. We have appealed to their native justice and magnanimity, and we have conjured them by the ties of our common kindred to disavow these usurpations, which would inevitably interrupt our connections and correspondence. They too have been deaf to the voice of justice and of consanguinity. We must, therefore, acquiesce in the necessity, which denounces our Separation, and hold them, as we hold the rest of mankind, Enemies in War, in Peace Friends.

We, therefore, the Representatives of the united States of America, in General Congress,

Assembled, appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the Name, and by Authority of the good People of these Colonies, solemnly publish and declare, That these united Colonies are, and of Right ought to be Free and Independent States, that they are Absolved from

all Allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain, is and ought to be totally dissolved; and that as Free and Independent States, they have full Power to levy War, conclude Peace, contract Alliances, establish Commerce, and to do all other Acts and Things which Independent States may of right do. — And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of Divine

Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes, and our sacred Honor.

This is an obit that one of his Army buddies was going to put in the ASA newsletter. It is very nice. Thought you might be interested.

Michael E. Metras— a man who parsed the difference between pilgrim, traveler and adventurer—died of heart failure June 26, 2018 in Santa Fe. He was 75.

Mike was a self-described pilgrimage guide and the long walk was his métier. While walking the 500-mile Camino de Santiago in Northern Spain in 2003, he met a kindred spirit, Petra Wolf. They married a year later. The couple walked other European pilgrimage routes, and then, in 2009, they set out on foot from Southern California for Jerusalem. The journey lasted 23 months and spawned the book, Encounters on the Road to Jerusalem. What he learned from walking 5,300 miles, he said, was the walk itself was the destination.

In 2013, they left the beaten path to begin an internal spiritual pilgrimage to India that lasted 4 years.

An author, photographer and numismatist, Mike was the son of the late Lawrence and Esther Metras. He was born in 1943 in Watervliet, Michigan. The family moved to Woodstock, Illinois, in 1953 where he attended Marian Central Catholic High School. After being graduated from the Loras College, he enlisted in the Army and was trained as a Swahili linguist. He served in Phu Bai, Vietnam, and Asmara, Ethiopia. He left the Army in 1970 and spent six months exploring East Africa and climbing Mt. Kilimanjaro.

He worked as a technical writer for Pansophic until his retirement in 2003.

Mike is survived by his wife Petra, a vision quest guide; two brothers, Maurice (Diane), and Martin; and three sisters, Marie Klapperich, Marcia Grubb (Daniel) and Madeline.

A Celebration of life will be held July 15 in Santa Fe.

<u>17-Jul-18 12:18pm St. Vincent's in Santa</u> <u>Fe NM SUNNY!</u>

I came to Petra's in Santa Fe from Mike's Memorial for Sunday at 4:00pm. I was eating breakfast at 9:00am and didn't feel right. I had an upset stomach that turned into vomiting, but nothing came out.

I thought this was altitude sickness. I through this because Woodstock was at 950 feet and Santa Fe was 7,200 feet. I have had something like this in the past. I drove from Woodstock to Santa Fe in 1-1/2 days. I just figured that my body had not adjusted to the altitude yet.

About 9:30-10:00 I had slight tightening in my chest. It felt a little like a heart attack. I decided to come to the hospital to get it checked.

In the next 16 hours they gave me a million test...well a hundred anyway. Seems it was gallstones. So, the testing is over or, so I thought.

This morning I got an echocardiogram. I need to wait until tomorrow, Wednesday, for all the blood thinner to be flushed out of my system. So, I wait now.

They will be removing my gallbladder tomorrow if all is right. I am still having pressure in my chest and get dizzy if I stand up too fast or move too quickly. All in all, I feel I am going to be home in a week.

They have been fantastic here at Christus St. Vincent Medical. Life is good!

Recovery

They told me that my recovery should be good and should be able to drive in a couple of days. I must clear this, but I am ready to be home!

26-Jul-18 9:57am @EWT 72° Sunny

It is a lot cooler that it has been where I was. I have been in Santa Fe recovering from having my

gallbladder removed on the 18th. The operation went well, and I could lay around no longer at Katie's in Santa Fe. The walls were closing in on me and the doctors told me it was ok to drive home if I took it easy. I figured on driving slowly and taking 4 days to get home. It took only 1-1/2 days to drive from Woodstock to Santa Fe.

I spent Thursday through Sunday resting and figured on leaving around noon to drive home. I finally left Katie's/Petra's around 3:30. I had a good time visiting with Vince & Lynn who were also staying a Katie's. Katie was away, and Vince & Lynn were staying at Katie's house too.

Katie is a friend of Mike & Petra's and owns the house where they were staying. Mike & Petra stayed in the round house in the summer when they are in the US. I think Katie travels a lot and Mike & Petra baby sit the big house while she is gone.

While I was recovering from my operation Petra, Lynn, and Vince were baby-sitting me. Thank you!

The Memorial

Sunday was Mike's Memorial and I got sick around nine o'clock. Petra drove me to the hospital because I was having a little of the feeling like when I did when I had the heart attack. I didn't want to take any chances. I found out later Sunday it was gallstones.

I missed the Memorial! I heard the Memorial went well. Sorry I missed it.

Hospital

Monday, they told me I needed to have my Gallbladder removed but need to wait for two days to let the blood thinners get out of my system. Wednesday, they removed my gallbladder and in two hours I was laying in my hospital bed recovering. Thursday, they let me leave.

The whole time I was in the hospital I had a great time. All the people were wonderful. I remember hearing someone say "...Starbucks...".

I walked over to the door and saw a security guard holding on to a cup of Starbucks coffee. I asked him "Did you bring me one of them?" he said, "Starbucks is only down stairs!" I said; "They won't let me cross this line without an escort!" while pointing to the line in the door way and smiling. We both smiled, and I went back into my room and looked at the newspaper.

A little later Bob, the security guard, came in my room and asked me if they let me have coffee he would go and get me one. I had no restrictions on my coffee. He asked me how I drink it and I said, "Lathe with Coconut Milk!" He said, "That's easy, that is how I drink it!" A few minutes later he was back with a Starbucks for me"

When they wheeled me down to the operation room he held the door for me and I found out his name was "Bob". I will remember Bob! Thanks again Bob!

<u>1-Aug-18 20:12 @home 73º almost dark</u>

Here it is August and I am getting ready to publish this issue. It has been a rough month or so. First Mike was sick, so I drove down to see him. Then he dies, and I went back down to Santa Fe for the Memorial. I missed the Memorial because of the gallstones. Then I needed my gallbladder removed.

Then I hung around at Katie's and Petra's until Sunday. Then I needed to drive home from Santa Fe. I took four days to get home. That is about 2-1/2 days longer than it took the last three times.

When I got home I had to rest up for a few more days but really didn't! I must get my pacemaker checked out and then my blood thinners and today I needed to visit with my cardiologist. Well, all in all things are going fine. I am still sore from the gallbladder removal, but I am doing fine.

This afternoon I looked at the grass and it NEEDs to be cut. Well, maybe baled! :-) I will work on that in a couple of days. I cut up some brush and burnt it this afternoon. When it was burnt down I watered it down and piled some more in the pile for after the wind is blowing out the south or south east. I don't want the guy next door to get too mad at me.


Main Computer


