I am not going out and buying thing just yet. I have a lot of dejunking to do to make the garage ready for this kind of project.

The 4'x 8' unit will just fit in the garage and still have room for a car, and some other things like a table saw, drill press, later a band saw, and maybe some other big tools.

I am talking from \$5000 to \$8500 to turn the thing on and do something. That is after the garage it ready.

I am thinking it may cost me up near \$7500 to fix up the garage.

That is clearing the garage, electrical, insulate, dry wall and heating it.

Just to get started I need to clear it and do electrical stuff, estimate \$500 – \$2000. Of course, I would do a lot of that. A garage sale would help recover some of the funds.

A heater could be from \$200 to \$800 depending how I go.

Insulation could cost \$2500 and the drywall up near another \$2500.

Wait, is the floor in the garage ok? I haven't had it cleared in years. That may need some work too.
