Fuel Cost

I see gas was \$4.13⁹ at Chark on Lake Street this morning. I also saw no one walking. They were all out there driving. I guess people are complaining but still diving.

I get very good gas mileage on my car so I don't complain a lot about the gas prices. I don't like paying out all that money either. I buy about 12 gallons of gas a month so it only would cost me \$50.00 to fill up my car. Wow, it is that much! I hadn't thought it was that much before just now. I only paid \$40.00 before I went on vacation last month.

Now it is time for me to change how I drive and how much. I think I will let you know a few things I know that save fuel. These will things I know that make a difference and in some case are easy to do.

When I went to work in Crystal Lake ever day I filled up with fuel about every 4 weeks. Now that I do not drive that far every day I still have to fill up about ever 4 weeks. I use the same amount of fuel but I drive less. I was getting 40 mpg two years ago and now I get only 30 mpg. It isn't the car it's the driving. The car would still get 40 mph if I drove to Crystal Lake ever day.

The difference is that when I drove to Crystal Lake the engine would get warmed up after 3 or 4 miles and then the performance of the engine is much better. What I am doing now is driver to the Restaurant, a mile and half, and shut off the engine and let it get cold then start it up and drive home. The same is true for running around. This mean the engine almost never gets up to operating temperature when it is performing up to snuff. I am sure a lot of us do this.

One thing that would help is to combine our running to do it in bunches. I could try something like going to Farm & Fleet, Menards, and then stop for coffee on the way home. The engine would get warm on the way to Farm & Fleet. It would still be warm when I get to Menards and when I stop for coffee. This would help a little in my case.

What I have found my car stops for coffee on the way out and I forget I was going to Farm & Fleet and Menards. That is a 3-1/2 mile round trip with an hour in the middle for the engine to cool down. This is not very good for gas mileage.

This is one of the reasons I am thinking about running my car on water. If you that the H2O apart and make it into HHO and feed it in to the air intake it will help the engine run better at cool temperature.

The other thing is to get an electric car. No warming up there. The only thing with an electric car is that I would be limiter on how far I could driver it in a day. Maybe only 50 to 100 miles because of the time it would take to charge it. With my normal driving it would be ok as long as I had a second car.

I think I will fill my car up and see how long I can go with out buying fuel again. For now how about combining trips with your car and see if it help your fuel usage.

Honda did such a good job on the design of the fuel system on the hybrid there is no easy way for me to hook any thing that would be different than the design calls for. Good afternoon. I have been ordering parts I need to make the invention that helps run the car with water. You may think I am foolish. Maybe I am. After read a lot of information I am feeling I could get a 20% increase in mileage by just feeding a very small part of HHO into the engine. This is H_2O (water) converted to a HHO gas. HHO is Hydrogen and Oxygen gas that is given off by using electrolysis to separate water. I just call it a HHO gas generator.

To try this, I required no real special tools or equipment. Most of the parts are available at the local hardware and auto supply stores. While I am experimenting with the concept I have order some parts from the parts on the internet. They are not any thing real special. It is that even with the shipping cost they are cheaper than driving to the local store and buying them.

I have built my first HHO gas generator out of scrap parts I found laying around the garage. It isn't pretty but does produce a lot of HHO.

Now I have to find some where to mount it under the hood of the car. The problem with my car is there is no room for any thing. The HHO generator is not some big device. In fact it is the size of a quart fruit jar. There is no room under the hood! If time permits, I am looking at finding a different place to mount it tomorrow.

Lawn mower using water

I cut my grass 1-3/4 times on a tank of gas with the water injector. That is not very good. I think it might be because how I have it hooked up. I just pushed the vacuum house into the intake of the carburetor until it started to suck air. I think it was messing up how the carburetor works. I do not want that to happen. So I am going to hook it to the other side of the carburetor. That would be right into the intake manifold. After that I will have to see what happens.

Car using water with the gas

This is getting to look more like it isn't going to happen. Do you remember I said that there was no where to put the HHO generator under the hood. This is the size of a quart jar. Well, it is a quart jar!

I thought I would put it in the trunk and run a vacuum like and a wire to the engine. I thought this would be easy enough. I got wire and I bought a spool of vacuum hose.

Well I looked thing over and checked out the manual to see where they ran the wires. It looked like they ran all the wires down the rocker panel under the doors.

I had to remove the plastic cover over the door jam between the front and back door on the passenger side. I used the passenger side just in cast I had to drive the car. I could leave it apart. Then I thought the rocker cover for the back door would be next. Yes but, I had to remove the rear back rest in the back to get it off. I had to remove the back seat first. Ok, back to the manual. Oh, another screw was hiding. Oh, those clips are tight. Ok, now back to the rocker cover. So the seatbelt needs to be unhooked.

Ok, center panel, lower panel, rear bench, back rest are removed and I haven't broke and thing and I have not drawn any blood. Sometimes when I take things apart I draw blood or pinch a finger or something. And my hands are still clean too!

While tracing the path of the wires from the trunk I see they go under the carpet. After lifting up the carper I see the wires go to the middle of the car. The path is not through the rocker as I thought. They go to the middle of the car and have a very tight path with plastic cover with no room for a wire, let alone a vacuum hose.

Since I had this opened up, I got a good view where things were routed. I don't want to mess up Honda engineering. I shouldn't be running my stuff in this channel. I looked it over many times. Then I put it all back together. I need to rethink this before I proceed.

I haven't giving up yet. I just need to backup and regroup.
