Garage Project

I think I have everything I need for the garage siding except for the siding. I asked while at Menard's if it would be in tomorrow as scheduled. They told me it is there and I could pick it up any time. I didn't have my receipts with me and I need a helper when I pick it up. My pickup has a six foot box and the boxes of siding are over twelve and half feet long. This means I need to put then on top of the pickup. It is better to take some one along when you have something that long and don't have a rack to tie it to. It isn't that the siding is heavy, just that it is long. The siding can stay on the pickup until we are ready to use it. It would be a good place to store until we are ready to nail it to the garage. At that point it can be stored on the outside of the garage nailed in place. There is could stay for 20-30 years. \odot Maybe I should go and cut the grass now. \odot

19-Sep-2008 7:29am 55°

Up a little early this morning. I drove the pickup to breakfast then to pickup the siding before coming home but forgot the paper work. After thinking about I figured I would wait until the earlier morning traffic dies down a little. With the siding being 12'6"

long and my pickup box only 6' I need to drive slowly because I don't have to stop along the road and pick it off the road.

Garage Projects

After getting the siding for the garage, I think it is the last thing I need to get for this project. I think I will have everything I need. It will be a case of just putting it all together. I am guessing by the end of the month I the siding project should be finished.

Task List

I had a task list all made out for the newsletter but I removed it. I figured it would bore you since it is near two pages long. Instead I made the list and stapled it to the side of the garage. It makes it seem to go faster when I can just draw a line through a task as it gets finished. I think I will just bore you with what gets done.

Today I got the window in the back boarded close, removed the corner boards, and swept the old loose paint off the walls.

Now that I have the corner pieces I know the corner boards will be in the way. They cut up nice to use to close up the window in the back.

Tomorrow will be 'Prime day.' All the rest of the trim needs to needs to be primed and then the finish paint can be applied.

Other things

When you order siding you should order it in to be delivered in dry sealed cartons. The siding was in wet carton that fell apart when we put in on the pickup the cartons fell apart. This doesn't hurt the siding any but it is a pain to haul it. I spent an hour tying it down so it wouldn't be all over the road driving home. I thought I had it tied well the first time. I got the pickup up to 10 mph and stopped. Yes the siding almost passed me. So I tied it some more. If the cartons were solid I would have had three cartons to tie down. Instead I had 60 pieces of siding to anchor down to keep it secure from the wind and my driving. Well I made it, but it was fun!

Garage Project

Bill came over to help today. Bill started of by priming the fascia and soffit while I nailed some of the old boards that looked loose. We finished that and brushed off a lot of the loose paint on the old siding so it would fall down and bunch up mad make lumps under the new siding. When I got done caulking around the windows and doors Bill was done with painting.

Then we tackled the Typar[®]. What is Typar[®]?

Woops, that is not what I used for, is it?

Here is the Typar[®] house wrap. "From the roof to the foundation, Typar[®] House Wrap creates a building envelope that protects your home from the damaging impact of moisture penetration."

Basically you wrap the building with Typar[®] to help keep the moisture and wind from going through the walls.

It comes in and roll that is 9 foot by 100 feet long. It is just big enough that it requires more than one person to install it. It is a big sheet and you just roll it out and staple it to the outside wall. Sounds easy enough, doesn't it?

I would have been easier if my stapler wouldn't have kept jamming up. After we got it hanging I was going around stapling while Bill was cutting off the extra. The garage is about 92 inched and the Typar® was 108 inched. So Bill had to go all the way around and cut off the extra. I think I stopped to fix the stapler 50 or more times. Once I would get through 200 staples before it would jam, most of the times it was 20.

I bought this stapler back in the '70s or '80s and I wasn't ready to shell out money to buy another one just to do the garage. I don't think I have used it in 10 or 15 years. Maybe the last time was when I put siding on the house in '94.

So I just keep fixing it until I had enough staples planted to help keep the wind from blowing the wrap off the garage and down the street. \oplus

When I finally finished it was lunch time. Now back from lunch I put things away for today. Tomorrow I will go back at it.

Garage Project

I have been working on the garage project off and on today. My body does not bend like it used to. Or maybe there is just too much behind my belt that gets in the way. I have been putting on the starter pieces for the siding. I have to do a lot of bending over to make that happen. Putting in a couple hundred nail standing on my head is not one of the thing I would put near the top of my things I like to do.

Anyway, all of the starters are on the bottom of the garage. This will help keep the Typar from getting air under it and blowing off. I have also snapped chalk lines for the corners. I also searched through the garage and fond all the left over siding from the house. Looks like the enough to do the front. I have 7 full pieces and a mess of small ones. The garage is 92" tall and the two 21' walls are and one is 20' and the garage door side is 20'. I should have enough siding to do three full sized with the new siding.

Let's see, each piece covers 10" of the 92" high. And the siding is 12' long and you only over lap about 1". To make this easer to figure I will use 11-1/2'. And I have 2 sides to cover. 20' + 21' + 21' = 62 feet got each row divvied 11.5' siding = 5.3 pieces of siding per row. And there are nine 10" rows. So 9 times 5.3 = about 48 pieces of siding. And then 6 pieces to go around the top for that last 2" that makes a total of 56 pieces. I have 60 pieces of the new siding. Looks like I should do just fine.

I was out working on the garage and I see these big holes at top in the outside corners where I removed the corner boards. The new corners wouldn't fit with the boards on the corners. I just figured the siding corners would cover them up. Yesterday I was think there had to be an easy way to fill them. I could just paint over them with a LOT of paint and it would not show.

Today I bought a can of the expanding foam. I figured I would fill the gap and I could cut it smooth and then just paint over it. I have done this other times so I figured that maybe it would work here too. What I forgot is that it takes 8 hours before it gets cures enough to be able to cut it. I read the can too quickly. On the label is says; "Dries tack-free in 15 minutes." And that is all I read. It also says; "Cures completely in about 8 hours." This means that I won't get the ready today. It will be almost dark in 8 hours.

I checked and it was tack-free but it is a long way from being cured! So much for getting that that part ready! And it rain maybe tomorrow.

Maybe I should just take a day off from the garage.

Email Fraud

Since I watch my email very well for SPAM, I have been seeing some emails that are most likely fraud. I know banks do not send emails out asking you to load software. I got this one that looks like it is from "Bank of America" and another one that looks like it is from "Wachovia". Both of them are exactly the same except the names. These two companies are competitors so it is most like they would not send emails that look exactly the same.

Here is what they look like:

WACHOVIA CORPORATION NOTICE.

At Wachovia we've re-imagined what's possible for online cash management.

The next step in the transformation of Wachovia Connection is access through a new Wachovia Security Plus Certificate.

This will allow you to access securely the Wachovia Connection and other online services.

All users will be notified and must manually install the Wachovia Security Plus Certificate. Installation takes about two minutes.

Start installation process now>> (I removed this link.)

What I do when is find these kinds of emails I look up the company's website and find their email address and/or phone number and forward the email to them so they can check it out. In most cases it is an email like abuse@wachovia.com in this case. Most companies have an abuse email account to handle fraud emails.

I have found that banks do not send out emails asking you to install software and they do not ask you your password. It just isn't done. Do not ever give it to anyone. It is the quickest way to lose all you money.

In fact if some one calls you on the phone and your personal information, don't give it to them unless you really know who they are. Just because they sound like they are someone from the bank check them out. Ask them who they are and get there phone number and tell them you will call them back. They may be just trying to get your personal information. You could be giving them your money.

Just look up the banks phone number and call them and verify that the person that called you is real and verify the phone number is one that the bank uses. If it check out it

most likely is safe. If not report what you know to the bank official. And do not call the caller back.

People have lost there life saving just from a simple phone call they receive.

If you are not sure call them and don't use the phone number in the email. You should have their real email.

We must work together to stop this abuse.

Garage Project

Well I did some of the painting. The soffit and fascia should also be painted before I do any of the corners. If paint gets dripped on the siding parts it will be no fun getting that off of it. I think it is better in the long run to get the painting done first.

The creator of the lifelike characters, Jim Henson, was born on this day in 1936. The puppeteer first named his puppets, Muppets, in 1954 when he was working as a producer of the Washington, D.C. TV show, Sam and Friends.

Henson moved his Muppets to network TV in 1969. Children of all ages were able to enjoy the Muppets' antics on the educational, yet entertaining Sesame Street. Later today I am going to help some one with there fractions. Things like (1/3 + 4/5 = x) and (3/4: 1/2 = y) and (1/8 times 1/4 = z) and maybe some (3/4 - 5/8 = w). This is going to be interesting because I haven't done this in a while. I have to re-learn how to do it. I think I understand how to get the answers but I have to teach someone how to do it so they can do it by them self. Doing it is the easy part, teaching is the hard part.

So the garage will wait for now. I have to learn how to teach first!

I can do these fairly easy. Here are the answers: x=3/5, y=3/8, z=1/32, and w=1/8. Now how do I teach it?

My watt meter that I have been using to check usage shut off so I do not have a reading for what my laser printer was using for a couple of days. I have to start new reading to get a feel for what that is using.

Ok, I just read the electric meter. I haven't saved any electric yet this month. I had turned on the dehumidifier in the basement after that rain and forgot. That sucked up a lot of electricity. I don't remember anything else I left on that was a big user. Just the other things I have talked about. There are 7 more days left before the 30 days of this billing cycle. Maybe I can make some changes before then.

It still looks like my computer servers are using the most of what I have measured so far. That group is at 23%. Of the 23%, 4.6% was the firewall and 7.1% was the backup server. That leaves 11.35 is the battery backup and the Web/Mail server and the routers.

Now that I have this broken down I will see what I can do to lower it.

This will take a while but if I can it working I can replace one or two servers and save half the energy they are using. Best get started.

After taking a break to have lunch I thought my arm would come back. It is even sore typing this. I guess it will wait until tomorrow.

After the soffit is finished I could starts working on the parts of the siding. The under sill and the "J" channel around the doors and windows parts could be installed. Oh, and the corner pieces. I should really finish the painting first. I'll give my arm a couple more hours to recover.

Yes it's Sunday and I am up already. I have been up long enough to have breakfast, Wash a load of laundry, and hang them out one the line to dry. Well from the looks of the sky, I may have hung them out to rinse. \bigcirc

I wanted to get an early start on the garage this morning. Once I get the trim pieces installed the siding should go very quickly. I have all the painting except the fascia done. I can paint that after the siding without getting paint on it.

I have to wait until there is a little more day light before I start. Not so I can see it is because of the mosquitoes. When I was putting the clothes on the line they were attacking me. It was dark enough when I was out there that the solar lights came on. I have a string of solar lights running between the to clothes polls so if some is out there after dark they do not run into the clothesline and hang themselves. They turn on after it gets dark enough. I have been up at four in the morning and have seen that they have been lit up. These run on free energy from the sun. So I just put them out there for safety.

29-Sep-2008 7:50am 51°

Yes I am up early again. I have been out for my morning cup of coffee and have been out working on the garage already. I thought I might be able to start a put a pieces or two of siding. I measured up all the lengths of the shorts pieces around the doors and windows and cut two pieces. It is too damp to start siding this early but I wanted to see how it started. I found out very quickly that starting these long floppy pieces of siding is almost imposable to do alone. I am usually very good at figuring out how to do things alone. This time I stopped and decided to ask for help. If I keep trying to do this alone I will get frustrated, crabby and pissed off at the world. Life is too short! So I will ask for help.

It looks like there is going to be a nice weekend coming up. And I think with two others helping it should take too long. Maybe two people measuring and installing and one cutting and moving materials and tools it wont take long at all.

In the mean time I will cleanup the work area and make it a more pleasant work environment. And besides I let the grass go to long. I might even have to mow it twice. Maybe I can get that done before it rains. And then I can start raking leaves. They are the next thing I will have to do after the siding.

After Breakfast

I intend to mow the grass! I wanted to eat breakfast so I went up to Angelo's and visited with Berry, Linda and Carol. While up there I remembered I was out of gasoline for the mower. So I decided I better get going so I could get this done. When I got the cashier I saw it had already started to rain. Bummer!

From the looks of the weather map the grass won't get cut today. Well I need to pay bill too! I'll do that.

Today's is Cork & Diane's Anniversary. How many years is it now. I know it is between 30 and 40 but I don't remember. They are on vacation so they must be enjoying their self. Happy Anniversary Cork & Diane!

30-Sep-2008 9:00am 48°

It is a cool on this morning. I have been up for a few hours now. Yesterday I set the mower to cut the grass an inch lower and tried to cut some of the grass. It had stopped raining for a while so I thought it was dry enough. It was way too wet. Later today I will try again if it doesn't rain again.

I was reading parts my book about my trip to Europe. I reading when I had walked too much and just reading it was making me tired. Melody is going to proof my book when she gets caught up. She has been busy earning a living.

So I put it a side to go for coffee. But I am typing here so I still need to go for that coffee now.

Wine Making

In the paper this morning I see someone was crushing grapes to make some wine. That reminded me that I need to make more pumpkin wine. I made some last year but I had some problems with it. I tried it before it aged and it tasted good so I bottled it. I was very, very new at this wine making stuff. I don't think I understood why you wanted to stop the yeast before you bottled it. I had put one bottle in the refrigerator to drink later. I put one aside to age and the other one I took with me to Mike and Petra's this spring.

I only got 3 bottles for some reason. I don't remember why. You normally get 4 or 5 bottles to a gallon. I wanted to share a bottle of each of my wines with Mike and Petra so I had 2 bottles of the California Red, 1 of Raison, and the bottle of Pumpkin. I wrapped then up in a big towel and put then in a plastic tote with a lid so they would break for the 2000 mile trip to Paso Robles. When I got there and got out the Tote and opened it I knew some thing was wrong. The towel was soaked in pumpkin wine. I just figured the thing wasn't corked very well and with the bumpy road trip the cork had came out. I had them on their side so they couldn't fall over and break. We had a good laugh about it and washed the smell from the towel and that was the end of it.

Later we tried the California Red and I learned why you have to age grape wine. None of us cared for it. I guess it would be called to green. I am not sure the proper wine word for it. Maybe it is bitter. What ever you call it, it wasn't good. We didn't even open the other two bottles.

The Pumpkin Wine

I had stored all of those other bottles of wine I bottled in the stair well to the basement. I stored then with the cork down. I had found out that you store wine on it side so the cork stays wet. If you store then upright the cork dries out and shrinks and then air gets into the bottle and the wine could very easily go bad. Since I had not made a place to store the wine in the basement yet, storing them upside down would be fine because they were in the cartons and staked well.

Here is where the fun starts. I was going to the basement to make a place about two month later when I saw the steps were wet. I traced it back to the cartons where the wine was sitting. I figured one of the bottles was leaking. The first thing I did was to start unpacking them one by one looking for the leaker. There were three 12 bottle cases there with maybe 5 bottles in the top one. When I opened the bottom case I had removed 3 bottles and POP, BANG! One of the bottles blew out of the carton went up to almost the ceiling and crashed to the cement steps and broken to a thousand pieces. I jumped back and started to laugh. There was enough of the label left that I could see it was the pumpkin wine.

After cleaning up the mess I finished moving the other bottles and then wondered about the cause. Laughing again and thinking it was a bottle rocket. This was bottled without stopping the yeast fermenting. Here is what happened. The wine was a little sweet and yeast likes sugar. Me too! When I bottled it wasn't finished and the fermenting process gives of carbon dioxide. The pressure built up and blew the cork. The bottle I

took to California was sealed in that plastic box with the lid and wrapped in the towel. When the cork blew it just leaked out and the towel sucked it up. The one in the boxes had heavy boxes of other bottles sitting on it. The cork pushed out enough to let some wine leak out to show me the leak. When I removed the weight from the top there was enough pressure in the bottle to blow the cork and shout the bottle into the air.

It is funny now but someone could have been hurt. So always make sure the fermentation has ceased and you put in some Campden in the wine to stop the yeast. Campden is really sodium metabisulfite s an inorganic compound of chemical formula $Na_2S_2O_5$. The name is sometimes referred to as *disodium* (metabisulfite, etc). It is used as a disinfectant, antioxidant and preservative agent.

I'll bet you are glad I told you that.
