
### 9-Jun-10 11:17am 77°



When I returned home I used the old crank pencil sharpener in the laundry room where I hang the clothespins.

#### Sharp Repair

Ok the sharpener that the blade fell off of it repaired. The sharpener is made from a cast piece of metal. I needed a little super glue to keep the screw from falling out again. Well all of the tubes have long since dried up. The wood glue had not dried up so with a tooth pick I put a drop under the blade and in the screw hole and tighten the screw.

You may wonder why wood glue on metal parts. Well the wood glue will fill the space in between the threads on the screw and also be sticky enough to hold the blade in place while I tighten the screw. It may never dry other than the part I slopped on top but it should help to keep the screw from falling out again for a long, long time. Long down the roads of time when it comes apart again it might be time to replace the whole thing. If not maybe I can have it welded into place. ©

wait to see how he gets out of this. I will have to wait until tomorrow or Friday to get the first DVD of season four.


You do know I already know he will survive. I use to watch all of the Flash Gordon films in the fifties. They always seem to make it too.

While I was printing I ran out of cyan ink then the printer jammed big time. When you print pictures on the thinner paper it doesn't dry in time and it is almost like using a wet paper towel. I usually use a higher quality paper to prevent this.

You do have to change the paper first. I forgot so I had a mess getting soggy paper out of the printer. I use higher quality thin papers so most of my printing it is just fine. When you are doing higher quality stuff the higher











quality paper is worth the dollar more for package.

Anyway after I un-jammed the printer and putting in the new cyan ink, I ran a quality test and had the clean the print heads too.
