Red Gold is the largest privately owned tomato processing company in the world and produces more than 90% of the ketchup that is found in the private label category....

I was carrying about ½ the weight in my small backpack that I will have in the big one. I had about 15 pounds. I did not have any problems carrying that weight. I have to go a little longer with out a break. I need to get use to about one hour maybe two with out a break. I am only going about thirty – thirty-five minutes, 1-1/2 miles before a break. There isn't very far to walk inside Woodstock before you get some wheres. I live in midtown. Wall-Mart and Farm & Fleet are way out on the edge and it may be 2 miles to Wall-Mart and just a little more to Farm & Fleet. Walking along the highway isn't very pleasant. When I go walking I like to have some where to go. I need to start thinking different about that. When I go to Spain I will be walking and walking and walking and if go the whole Camino de Santiago I may get tired. So if I just head for the next village or town then it will be shorts walks. From the looks of the map it is takes about 7-8 hours to drive from Roncesvalles to Santiago, Spain. Or maybe 40 days and 40 nights to walk. Wonder why I have decided to try to walk it?

Yesterday I went to work to help them out with some stuff. I was there 6 hours. It was nice to see some of the people. It was still work that I did. From the email I got I think it is fixed.

I just remembered there was some more of that lonely hearts gossip to report from last night. This guy likes this lady but there may be another guy there too. I just got use to using them and I find many things I do work better for me. I do still know how to use a pencil and paper. I plan on using then while in Europe. That is unless I find a computer sitting there calling me to it.
