
Big sucker

Farm and Fleet.

I started to Farm & Fleet on Tuesday and finally got there this morning. Now I can go out and finish Monday's project. I put a cover on the motor home to keep it nice and warm for the winter. Well it won't keep it warm, but it will help to keep it clean and dry. I need to pick up another rope. Even though this cover has a good bunch of tie downs to keep it from blowing around it still fills with air and blows around a lot.

Speaking of blowing around, DO NOT put a cover of this size on alone! It filed up with air so many times and got blown back on the roof that I was ready to guit. The basic idea is you unfold it and drag it up top and from the back then drop the side down while walking to the back and go down the ladder. Then you walk around pulling the sides all the way down. At this point you fasten the straps and tie the front and back to get rid of the looseness.

Yah, right! To start with it was backwards. I needed to turn it around. Do not turn it around while up on top! Then I saw that it was outside out and it is easer if it is inside out got unfolding it to drape down the sides. So off the roof and back on the ground. The cover, not me. Well, I went down the ladder. On the lawn I found the front and unfolded the whole thing. Boy is that big!

So I folded it by turning the inside out and having the front in the front. I then rolled from back to front so it could be moved more easily. I carried it to the back, hooked it on a rope, up the ladder and on to the roof and dragged it to the front. Great, the front is in front and all I have to do now is unfold it and let the sides drop down then go down on the ground and finish up the job. All sounds easy, yes? No, every time I would get a little or the side down a little puff of air would come by and decide it was going to put the thing back on the roof.

I do not give up too easy. After 8-10 tries that wind took a break and I got it started. Quickly I went down the ladder and over where the straps were and tied the cover to the fence so I could get back up on the roof. Wait, I think I use bricks the first time. They didn't work. I used the fence the second time. Back on the roof and still had some trouble. Yes! This is another one of the five minute projects. Anyway I kept fighting the wind even though it wasn't really much more than a puff once in a while. Then I had tied it too short to get the thing and had to untie it to give me more room. It was good exercise going up and



down that ladder. 10-15, maybe even 20 times. So finally I got it pulled down all the way around. It was time to untie it from the fence. I almost untied the whole thing. What a mistake that would have been. The wind had picked up by then and it would take off like a big kite. Yes, a kite the size of a bus! So I took one on the straps at a time and ran them under the motor home add hooked them to the other side. When I had that done, I needed to get under the cover and close the door and up on the roof to put cardboard over the sharp points so it did not punch a hole in the cover.

You may ask; "What does Farm and Fleet have to do with this?" I bought the first rope there and I needed another one to finish the project. The rope goes from front to back and back to front about 1/3 of the way from the bottom and I feel another one 1/3 of the way from the top will keep that sucker from flapping in the wind. So it only took about 3 days to finish this "5 minute project." Well I think it's done now and I will ask for help the next time. It's official, the motorhome is in hibernation for the winter.
