
Oldest Motorhome

Charles Kellogg owned and drove the world's oldest RV. The RV itself, a motorhome, was not so old, but the material it was made from -- a one-piece carved-out log of a 4,800-year-old coastal redwood tree -- surely gave it a solid claim as the RV made of the oldest materials.

Charles Kellogg was born in the California High Sierra in 1868. His neighbors were Indians, who became his teachers. One thing that young Charles learned was to sing like birds. Later, he performed his bird calls around the world. They were recorded by the Victor Talking Machine Company.

An even more remarkable talent was Kellogg's ability to extinguish a flame of fire with this voice. Because of his unique talents, for a time he was the most popular headliner in Vaudeville.

But independent station dealer George Urich changed all that in 1947 when he opened three "self-service" Gas-A-Terias in the Los Angeles area. The idea: motorists would save money by doing their own pumping. Instead of hiring attendants to clean windshields and check oil, Urich hired attractive girls in slacks and tight sweaters and put them on roller skates to race around to collect money. The gas stations were huge -- 18 to 21 pumps on islands at right angles to the street. On average, a motorist saved five cents a gallon -- a big deal back in those days. Gas-A-Terias were so successful that copycats followed. . . and you know the rest of the story.

Saving Energy

Since I have past the pickup to others to deal with, I started to wonder how often I had used it as a pickup. I had it around 7-1/2 years, and put about 7500 miles on it and got about 15 miles to the gallon. That means I used about 500 gallon of gas. That means in those 7-1/2 years I could have drove about 20,000 miles with my car. But on the other hand, I would have only got about 4,000 miles in the motor home. In the motor home, that is a nice drive to Arizona and back. In the car, I could go from Woodstock to Walla Walla, to Los Vegas, to Dallas, to Key West, to New York, and then back to Woodstock TWICE and maybe still have gas left over.

So I think I will start thinking about saving more energy. I bought one of those energy saving compact fluorescent light bulbs 11 or 12 years ago. It cost big bucks back then. And you had trouble finding them. I used it in my computer room up until last year when if finally failed. Since then I have replace almost ever one of the old bulbs with the energy saving light bulbs. I think I paid \$11-12 dollars a piece for those many years ago. Now you can buy them for a buck if you look around, and you can get them almost everywhere they sell bulbs. I think I have not had another fail either.

They really are cheaper to use. If you have a 26w compact fluorescent and use it 4 hours for a year it will cost you about three dollars to use. A 26w fluorescent put the same light as an 100w regular bulb that would cost you eleven dollars a year. That is a saving of about \$7.00 per bulb And over the life of about 10 years that is about \$70.00. This is per bulb! I just

counted 12 bulbs. So at current electric cost, I could save over \$800.00.


