After all the inconvenience the other day getting my Camper started. I decided to buy one of the booster packs for helping start a dead car battery.



Camino de Santiago

I have not talked much lately about walking the Camino in a while. I just checked the cost of the plane ride, and it is \$1,134.00 for the end of April returning early July.

I still have not found any that is toying with the idea.

I just checked the current estimates. Seems you could make the trip for as little as 20 € per day. That plus your gear and transportation to get to and from the Camino.

I was gone 53 days in 2012. I paid around \$2,000 for transportation.

I am thinking I should plan on 90 days this time. They say you could walk it in 30 days, but those people end up with leg and feet problems. Slow and steady to avoid blisters and leg problems.

Let us say 60 days at 20€ plus 2,500€ that would be about 3,700€. That is about \$4,000 US.

High end thy say 40€ plus transportation. That is about 4,900€ or about \$5,200 US.

Today's price for one Euro is \$1.06 US. When I went in 2012 1 Euro cost \$1.66 US.

That makes the cost about the same as the last time. If memory serves, I spent around \$4,000 last time.

I need to think on this more. \$5,000 is not too bad! \$650 a week or \$2,500 a month for 60 days for a high-end trip.

Happy Birthday Marie! Marie has always been my younger sister; even though she was born before me. Therefore, I have no idea of her real



Anyway, I left Woodstock Die Cast in April 1983, so I had no more reason the count those days.


I missed my target date. It became longer after I started working at Knaack.
