Some things seem bad until you think about it a little.


I must go and work on my project now.

## Train layout

Well, I did get my turnout Servo sample working. I know what I need to do to have the turnouts work with a push-button switch and have the light come on to show where the train can go.

Most of these controller servos will be out of sight under the layout. There are a few that I will need to hide the servo near the track on the surface. We will see.

I have ordered some telegraph poles to hold the wire for these servos. That way I can have some telephone poles running some wires that have some real use. Either that or I must find some place to hide those wires for the servos.

And I finished getting all the track laid out, so I can finish gluing it down. That may be later today.

I am using a mixture of Elmer's glue and water to hold the track. After I put down the ballast it will be glued more securely.

After the track is glued, I can put in the wirings and hook some of it up to make sure things are assembled ok. The track must have electricity going through it for the engines to run.

I may need to solder the tracks together in some places. That is for later.

There was some other thing I did too. I glued down the overpass where the train crosses the river. Yes, there is a river, though it is a dry river right now. This required a lot of weights to hold it in place while the glue dried.

The first side took overnight. The second side took 24 hours. Well, the weights are still on it.

I also filled the gaps on the supports so it might look better after it gets a little paint.

That is why I never got outside yesterday.
